<u>Tips</u>: Type in the Search box on the <u>right side</u> of the screen (within publication) to find your god or goddess. Use the citation tool on the right side of the screen to find the citation for your book. **Do NOT include the URL in your citation.**

<u>Tips</u>: You can search by topic, or select *Table of Contents*, and search for your topic there. The citation link on the left side menu provides the MLA citation. Be sure to select MLA. **Do NOT include the URL in your citation.**

**<u>NOTE</u>**: There is an error in the online example. The <u>second</u> author's name should be first name and then last name. The example given here is correct.

Tips: Once you log in, scroll down on the main page and select "Mythology"

#### Do NOT include the URL in your citation.

**<u>NOTE</u>**: You must italicize the title of the database.
